

# Safe & Fun Trick-or-Treat Tips for a Spooktacular Halloween

Halloween is right around the corner and soon enough trick-or-treaters will be visiting your neighborhood. Prepare for the holiday by following these tips to have a fun, safe, and spooktacular night!

### **Tips for Homeowners**

- I. Darkness in and around a home is interpreted as the homeowner wishes not to be disturbed. If you want trick or treaters to come to your door, keep your lights on both inside and out. Often times people will still attempt to knock even if your lights are off so it is still a smart idea to make sure that there is enough light for pedestrians to be able to clearly see where they are walking.
- 2. Clear any clutter or debris that may be blocking your walkway or driveway. Make sure there are no obstacles in the way that could cause children to trip or get injured.
- 3. Be cautious if you have candlelit carved pumpkins as decoration outside your home. They can present a fire hazard to both your home and trick-or-treaters. A smart alternative is plug-in or battery-powered jack-or-lanterns.
- 4. Keep your pets confined and away from all of the excitement. The commotion could rile them up and cause them to dart out the door or bark and bite.
- 5. You don't always have to pass out candy. Feel free to get creative with your goodies and look for healthier alternatives or even fun pencils, rings, or glow-in-the-dark decals.

### Tips for Those Accompanying Young Trick-or-Treaters

- 1. Have each child wear something lit, like a glowstick, or carry a flashlight with them. Also, try to make sure that they wear well-fitting shoes and avoid costumes that may drag on the ground.
- 2. Be sure to only visit homes that are well lit. Porch lights and lit interiors are indicators that the homeowner is participating in passing out candy. It is recommended that you don't trick-or-treat after 9 p.m.
- 3. Children should walk and not run while trick-or-treating. Stay on the sidewalks and never cut across yards, driveways, or busy streets. If you are driving during peak hours be very vigilant of children in and around the street.
- 4. Always stay in groups and never leave children unattended. Trick-or-treaters are advised to never enter homes or vehicles without supervision.
- 5. Before letting your trick-or-treaters eat their candy, closely inspect their collection for anything opened and toss what you might suspect should not be eaten.

Halloween is not only a fun night for the kids but is also a great way for your community to bond. Enjoy your neighborhood and have a great night!

## **Cupcakes:**

- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 1 1/3 cups graham flour
- 2 tsp baking powder 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 1/2 tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 1/4 cups unsalted butter, softened 2 cups packed light-brown sugar
- 1/4 cup honey 6 large eggs
- 2 tsp pure vanilla extract



### Frosting:

- 1 cup butter, softened 4 cups powdered sugar z tsp milk
- 10 oz mini marshmallows Chocolate glaze

### **Preparation**

Cupcakes: Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a medium bowl, whisk together both flours, baking powder, salt and cinnamon. In a mixer bowl, cream together butter, brown sugar, and honey on medhigh speed until pale and fluffy. Reduce speed to medium; beat in eggs and vanilla, scraping down sides of bowl as needed. Add flour mixture; mix until just combined. Divide batter evenly among lined cups. filling each about 3/4 full. Bake about 25 minutes, rotating pans halfway through. Cool pans on wire rack for 10 minutes, then turn cupcakes out onto racks to cool completely. **Frosting:** Beat butter until smooth. Add powdered sugar slowly and then milk and mix until smooth. Set oven to broil. On a baking sheet lined with parchment paper, spread marshmallows out in an even layer. Broil for about 45 seconds until marshmallows are browned and puffed. Immediately scrape hot marshmallows into the butter mixture and beat until smooth. Allow frosting to cool completely before spreading or piping. To finish each cupcake, spoon on 2 tsp chocolate glaze and pipe on frosting.
